1	Integrated Sustainable Taskforce (ISTT) (previously Active Travel Forum)	<ul> <li>Background: The purpose of the 'ISST' is to enable CWaC to consult a diverse group of engaged members who will provide feedback in respect of projects that the council decides to pursue. Formed from 3 separate groups including the Active Travel Forum. The ISST leader is Rose McArthur.</li> <li>Latest (July): Eventually got agreement (although diluted) – seeking meeting with Cllr. Planning Applications	<ul> <li>Background: CNC monitor planning applications to ensure they meet requirements of Active Travel design and establish whether any S106/CIL monies can be obtained to further our objectives.</li> <li>Latest (July): Majority happening in Helsby not Frodsham, especially around Tesco (700 dwellings). Active Travel haven't really benefitted. ST indicated that there are two separate applications (sports club and old Honeywell site) – could we get a cycling path in front of it but there was resistance – ST suggested we could revisit plus pick up other plots with developers, will revisit planning applications to discuss cycling ways. SP mentioned a similar project in Chester. ST said we can't claim despite our neighbourhood plan – CLC not s.106. Significant s.106 contribution from the developers on the Honeywell site (planning has just been approved). SP confirmed that although getting a single cycle path is the end game, taking opportunities to get fragments are still worthwhile ambitions as part of the longer game. 

## Final update

Work is now at completion stage on the active travel improvement scheme between Helsby High School and Frodsham. The surface dressing has now been completed with just the road markings to be replaced, however, sweeping of the loose chippings will be ongoing as and when required but these should be mainly bedded in now. Please note that the surface dressing was not part of the scheme but it made sense to delay our finishing works until this was completed.

Thursday 21 July from 7pm to 6am – A road closure will be in place for road marking work following the surface dressing last week. Please note that the section of the A56 from Godscroft Lane to Matty's Lane will be under a full road closure (including no access onto the A56 from the junctions of Tarvin Road or Woodhouses Lane). Access will only be permitted to Emergency Services and to residents, however, a short delay may be incurred at times. If possible, please minimise trips through the area, so as not to slow the works down or create safety issues.

The remaining segregators for the cycleway are on site and currently being bolted down between Tarvin Road and Matty's Lane. The finishing of the grass seeding to the verges (which has a mix of grass areas and wildflower areas along the route) will be completed when we have imminent rain forecast. The cycleway work should be completed by Friday and will be opened up for full use by Friday evening (22 July).

As previously mentioned, there will be programmed works to plant bulbs along the route which is expected to be arranged for September/October - bulb planting time. Also, please note that as the works have progressed, the existing footway has been cleared and we have noted areas that require some general maintenance

	work. We will aim to carry these repairs out during school holidays where possible to cause minimal disruption.
