Helsby- Mouldswort h	Background: SP stated that this has now become a core Sustrans project, which is a big advantage (hence standalone item rather than inclusion with shovel ready project) Previous action: JG video dependent on Chris Copeman availability. Meeting w/c 16/5 with Network Rail, CNC, and Sustrans (CWAC have been invited) – SP will attend on our behalf with PM as deputy as req for limited numbers. Sustrans project so keen to let them lead it. Latest (July): No news from Chris Copeman on Helsby-Mouldsworth railway line – dependent on CC – FW suggested that now would be an ideal time to go as mostly dry (despite the amount of greenery that there is likely to be), FW has got down to the track near Manley. SP drew attention to the countrywide programme around the path in Warwickshire, a very similar project. Sustrans advised that DfT had funded that project so there is precedent. Sustrans leading. ST suggested speaking with Cheshire Wildlife Trust (FW has relationship with Kevin Feeley) so when the project is progressed, we could use that relationship and get them involved. July JE to donate an old bike for SP/FW to 'bring back to life on the day' and give the bike away to someone who visits the stand – free bike for someone.



		as and when required but these should be mainly bedded in now.	
		Please note that the surface dressing was not part of the scheme but	
		it made sense to delay our finishing works until this was completed.
